Our rescue model is working. Even during this pandemic year, you funded an average of **2 rescues per day!**

Our freedom model is also thriving. I want you to know the vast majority of young girls who enter our care are **still free** because you are funding her path to freedom -- a safe place, urgent health needs, education, temporary economic assistance, emotional health, and sharing the good news!

Childhood restored

11-year-old Nary* had to work to help provide for her family. A family friend would drive her home from work. On the way home he would sexually abuse her and threaten her if she told. Her abuser was brought to justice and sentenced to 12 years in prison.

Nary came to live in one of our homes where she would receive love and the proper care to help her heal. Months later the world went into lock-down due to the pandemic, forcing us to close our residential care homes in Cambodia. Our staff worked hard to place each girl back into a safe family member's home, setting up communication and providing supplies and food.

Nary, now 12, worked well to recover from her trauma. Her family is now more unified and working together to turn their lives around. With financial support provided by our community care program, they are building a home and a secure life.

The Philippines

2-3 rescues per week on average
(Raids were 19% of our rescues)

Prior to the pandemic, our team successfully executed "Operation Domino". This consisted of four operations, 31 rescues, and three arrests all within 6 hours. These were 4 of 20 successfully executed raids which resulted in 29 arrests.

Cambodia

1 rescue per week on average

Our team, while keeping rescue efforts strong, focused on building our reintegration program.

This program includes receiving counseling, education, vocational training and health checks while living at home. This service is only available if a survivor's family passes a safety review. We were able to deliver crucial food supplies to the families of survivors in our care during the pandemic.

Nepal

3-4 rescues per week on average
(38% of our rescues came from border rescue)

Over 25,000 young women and children are trafficked each year across the border. We expanded our partnerships with government authorities and law enforcement to utilize 10 border crossing stations, staffed with our agents trained and empowered to identify trafficking situations and prevent the victim from crossing the border.

95% of those we rescue have never experienced abuse.

Thailand

1-2 rescues per week on average

Our caseworkers take on the role of friend, teacher, advisor and second parent to the girls who have been rescued. Subin, one of our caseworkers, visits children in his care and their families throughout the week. He follows up with educational progress, helps in obtaining proper identification, and supports with counseling and basic needs. He also helps find safe jobs and gets progress reports from their managers.

Dominican Republic

2-3 rescues per week on average

After our story of rescuing a 14-year-old girl and her 5-month-old baby from abuse and child marriage made the news, a father reached out about his 14-year-old missing daughter. In coordination with the local police, we were able to rescue and reunite her as well as arrest her abuser.

Undisclosed Nations

For the safety of children and staff, the locations of some of our work must remain undisclosed.

On average we had 1-2 rescues per week, seeing an increase as we did food drops that enabled more individuals to be found and freed.

In spite of the pandemic, we successfully launched rescue operations in a new country. The average age of the victims rescued was 14 and the youngest was a 7-year-old girl.

We focused on partnership building and strengthening government agencies to coordinate rescue and follow-up services to survivors.
